

Adult Education and GED Prep/Testing

Students lacking a high school diploma or equivalent can participate in adult education/GED preparation at ISTC. Co-enrollment permits students to participate in adult education while enrolled in career technical training.


2021-22 Enrollment: 555

The alternative high school diploma option program is a partnership between ACCS- Adult Education Division and Alabama State Department of Education that provides an opportunity for students to earn a high school diploma from the last high school they attended.


80 EDOVO Tablets in Use

January 2023 – June 2023



Tutwiler-Ingram Career Center

The Tutwiler Ingram Career Center is a **partnership** with J. F. Ingram State and the Alabama Departments of Corrections, Labor, and Commerce. Staff from the Alabama Career Centers and Vocational Rehab work with Ingram State students, that are within 6 months to one year of release, on a weekly basis. Ingram students have an opportunity to register in both the Alabama Works and WIOA systems, while learning about resources that will assist in their **employment and re-entry** needs once released.







ISTC Foundation

ISTC Foundation is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization dedicated to assisting ISTC students and graduates.

Each year the Foundation provides ISTC graduates preparing to enter the workforce with tools and equipment, as well as funds to offset the costs of licensure and certification.

The Foundation supports currently enrolled students by offsetting costs for a variety of industry recognized certifications including OSHA-10 hour safety, EPA refrigerant handling, MSSC Certified Logistics Associate and Certified Logistics Technician, and Microsoft Office Specialist.



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
